Neoclassical Architecture in France

The leading Neoclassical architect in France was Jacques-Germain Soufflot, who spent time in Rome and Lyon before establishing himself in Paris During his travels to Italy, Soufflot saw archaeological discoveries from Classical Antiquity first-hand, which exerted tremendous influence over his own later architecture In Rome, he witnessed

SOUFFLOT The rationalist movement came somewhat later in France. Its first great monument, the Pantheon in Paris (fig 871), by Jacques-Germain Soufflot (1713-1780), was built as the church of Ste-Genevieve, but secularized during the Revolution.
