### **Definitions of Common Terms Used in Long-Term Care and ...**

Acute Care: Medical care for health problems that are new, quickly get worse, or result from a recent accident Acute care has recovery as its primary goal, typically requires the services of a physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, nurse, or other skilled professional, and is usually short-term It is usually provided in a doctor's office, a clinic, or a hospital Adult Day
